### Year 7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch-up premium

#### Impact statement - 2016/17

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in Reading or Mathematics at the end of the key stage 2 (KS2). There were 79 pupils identified as being in need of support to achieve the expected standard in English with 10 identified as a high priority. 55 pupils are also in of support to achieve the expected standard in Maths with 8 being a high priority as well.

In 2016/17 the school received £13,461 for the catch-up premium.

#### Impact of interventions

- In English, out of the 79 pupils identified as needing support 85% are currently on track and making the expected progress.
- In Maths, out of the 55 pupils identified as needing support 87% are currently on track and making the expected progress.
